# Valuing Our People

At SOAR365, we're proud to offer programs for people with disabilities that support personal growth, independence, health and happiness.

In 2022, families welcomed the return of our much-needed Respite program. Open to ages six and up, Respite allows participants to enjoy a weekend away with friends while caregivers take time to care for themselves.

Summer Camp also provided overnight care through a sleepaway camp experience! Both old friends and new enjoyed horseback riding, swimming, arts and crafts, paddle boating and our famous talent show.

Our Children & Youth Program boosted independence by helping participants transition to adulthood. Our SOARing Forward curriculum focuses on career exploration, work-based learning experiences, post-high school education and training programs, social and independent living skills, and self-advocacy lessons.

Meanwhile, Adult Day Support at Saunders started their very own Aktion Club! Offered through Kiwanis, this service club is designed for adults with disabilities. Participants learn leadership skills while volunteering in the community.



Meet Trey

Nobody was sure what to expect when **Trey** returned to Adult Day Support, after suffering abuse and neglect during the pandemic. "When the van driver opened the door, and I saw him grinning from ear to ear, that just warmed my heart," says Assistant Supervisor, **Josh Rubino**.

Everyone agrees Trey is a bright light and a jokester. "He's the life of the house; he keeps everybody laughing," says the director of Trey's group home.

Trey's cousin and co-guardian, JaWanda Hope, credits SOAR365 for playing a huge role in Trey's recovery. He waits excitedly each weekday for the van to arrive, so he can see his favorite staff members and friends. "You guys are his family," she says.



# Meet Rusty

**Rusty Graham**'s favorite things are playing sports, creating art and making new friends. It's no wonder, then, that if you ask him his favorite part of SOAR365's Summer Camp, he says, "Everything!"

Rusty, who has Down syndrome, is also a lifelong Boy Scout. This makes him feel right at home in the peaceful woodlands of Camp Baker.

While he arrived at camp with one close friend, Rusty left with many more. He can't wait to come back and see them all again this summer!



# Supporting Our Staff

This year, we were excited to bring back familiar faces! We welcomed **Jerri Vincent**'s return as a direct support professional (DSP) in Adult Day Support. Jerri wanted to be a DSP since she was a child, when she'd attend work with her mother at Southside Virginia Training Center.

## Meet Ronnie

At nearly two years old, Ronnie still wasn't meeting certain milestones. His mother, Kimberly, began to investigate, leading her to Pediatric Therapy at SOAR365.

"Ronnie couldn't articulate or speak," Kimberly explains. "Now, he's speaking in sentences and loves language." At five years old, he was able to say, "Mommy, I love you," for the first time, and Kimberly was brought to tears.

Today, the third grader is a voracious reader and avid LEGO builder. "I believe that everything Ronnie has gained is due to the therapy he received at SOAR365," says Kimberly.



## Meet Gavin

Gavin is nonverbal, but he has a lot to say.

One morning, he was making his signature gesture for "I want..." His mom, Amy, began running through the list. Did he want his sister, his grandma, food, water, TV? No, none of those. Finally, Amy asked, "Do you want to go to SOAR365?" Gavin broke into a huge grin and began nodding excitedly.

"That just made me so happy," says Amy.

At SOAR365's Children & Youth Program, Gavin gets to enjoy a variety of activities, explore his community and make lasting friendships. Most importantly, his mom can trust that he's getting the assistance he needs to thrive.

"Gavin needs lots of support," Amy explains. Alfi's syndrome not only affects communication, but also causes low muscle tone, changes in mobility, and global developmental delays.

"He's curious, he's happy, he's affectionate. And he needs a lot of help with the activities of daily living."

SOAR365's direct support professionals are experienced in communicating with Gavin and handling all of his support needs. This gives him more independence, and it allows his family members to pursue their own activities as well.

Amy says she can rest easy, knowing that when Gavin is at SOAR365, "He's safe, he's cared for, [and] he's in a loving environment."

# The Face of Excellence

SOAR365's Business Solutions unit proudly employs more than 90 people with disabilities across our Landscaping & Grounds Maintenance, Janitorial & Custodial Services, Administrative Services, and Assembly & Logistics divisions. Each team works on commercial and government contracts that generated more than \$12 million in revenue in 2022.

When you walk onto the production floor at SOAR365 @Westwood, you never know what project you're going to see the Assembly & Logistics team working on. From packaging to fulfillment to kit assembly, this team of more than 30 SOAR365 employees is always busy.

The Assembly & Logistics team can be a great fit for individuals with disabilities who want to work but aren't quite ready for a competitive job in the community. They do impressive work on a quick turn-around, including jobs like sorting and shipping 10,000 headsets; packing more than 59,000 boxes of fatwood; and cleaning, inspecting and preparing nearly 420,000 shipping totes.



Mark Braithwaite, Director of Assembly & Logistics, is impressed by his team's adaptability and unwavering, can-do attitude. "The team is eager to partner with customers and learn new things," says Mark. "If a client has a project that we've never done before, everyone is motivated and excited to take on the task...you'll hear everyone say, 'We can learn how to do that!'"

Businesses are learning that by hiring employees with disabilities, they not only improve those employees' self-worth and financial independence, but they gain hard-working and loyal team members.

Our Employment Services team is dedicated to helping people with disabilities find, secure and succeed in the right jobs for them. We help program participants get competitive jobs in the greater Richmond community and also find ways to support our own 90+ employees with disabilities.

We get to know each individual's interests and talents. By conducting situational assessments, setting up needed supports and providing on-the-job guidance, our employment specialists set a solid foundation. Then, they can step farther back as each employee thrives on their own.



As these individuals thrive, so do their companies. **Chris Martin**, Director of Employment Services, explains, "These businesses are seeing the value of embracing a diverse, inclusive work force, which includes people with disabilities. SOAR365 is happy to support them as they grow in that direction."



# Facing In:

Myra Lewis is a SOAR365 employment specialist who helps our Business Solutions staff members with disabilities. When she first met Samuel, he was not feeling confident in his role as a janitor. Myra's first step was an on-the-job assessment, followed by discussions with his project manager and crew leader to understand the requirements of the role. Samuel's autism affects the way he understands and initiates work tasks, and Myra took the time to understand both his challenges and goals.

Myra collaborated with SOAR365 case managers to create an internal support plan. This included a customized job, with slightly altered tasks, and a manual for his management team with instructions on how to support Samuel. With these tools in place, Samuel is excelling at his job, and he—and his team—are shining bright.



The Truist Foundation focuses on building career pathways to economic mobility. Thanks to their gift of \$15,000 towards our Supported Employment program, SOAR365 provided employment services to more than 49 individuals in 2022.



# Facing Out:

**Dylan** came to SOAR365's Supported Employment program after finishing high school. The first step for **Leo Castro**, a SOAR365 employment specialist, was to conduct a situational assessment with Dylan. Leo found that Dylan likes detailed work and is organized, positive and motivated.

Leo immediately thought of Brandito, a local supplier of corporate apparel and promotional marketing materials, as a possible employer fit. After Dylan shadowed the job and completed an interview, Brandito hired him as an e-commerce warehouse associate.

Dylan doesn't speak much, so reading his body language is key for the other staff, something Leo taught them to do. "Dylan loves working at Brandito, and Brandito values him as an employee," says Leo. "That is the ideal situation."

From completing online applications to role-playing for an interview, the Supported Employment team is there every step of the way.

# Looking Beyond 2022

### SOAR365 continues to be financially healthy.

Like many nonprofits, we've been operating in a cash deficit due to the pandemic. But thanks to government support, we've been able to stay open and stay focused on welcoming more participants. And it shows! Our core revenue increased 13% in 2022. Improved program participation played a key part, as well as rate increases from Medicaid and Business Solutions' contracts. At the same

time, our expenses rose by 22%. Bringing back more participants meant adding more staff to support them. We're invested in finding and keeping the best people, so we made market-based adjustments to many employees' compensation. Higher facilities and vehicle costs were also expected as we opened our locations back up and readied our vans for community-based programming.

We're still here...and we're growing! Our cash position is strong as we come out of the pandemic. We anticipate revenue will continue to climb as we expand our programs and services. We're also planning on additional government support in 2023. This will enable us to continue in this environment for the foreseeable future.
